Your part of the deal is to send one (or more) of these brochures out with every piece of your art that you sell. And it would be great to send one out to past clients who you know have not transferred ownership of pieces they have previously bought from you.

The brochure explains the importance of the transfer. Please start sending out this brochure with any shipments and let's get your clients wised up about FAR

Why transfer ownership of your newly acquired piece of art?
After all, you have a certificate of authenticity, haven't you?
Unfortunately, a certificate of authenticity is so easy to forge or alter that on its own it doesn't mean very much. This is where the Fine Art Registry will aid and separate you.

Each FAR card is unique, is tamper evident and is virtually unalterable. And each signed piece is recorded in a central database along with a full description and photos. Your art will be safe. You will also have instant provenance. Your piece will appear in your own gallery on the FAR website and you can direct your family and friends to the gallery to see what you own. Should you wish to sell the piece, or to list it on through the Fine Art Registry (no commission), you have, well, tried it very easy, affordable, trustworthy and provenance.

What is the Fine Art Registry?
Fine Art Registry is today's only high-tech solution to the age-old problem that has existed in the art world since before the Ancient Greeks: How to establish provenance, prove authenticity and ownership, prevent forgery and fakery, deter theft and, basically, make it possible to create, buy and sell works of art with the security of knowing that they are what they claim to be.

FAR is...

- ↳ a web site where artists can permanently register their art when they create it and where collectors, investors and galleries can find their "safe place"
- ↳ a high-tech, secure, tamper-evident system of works of art which helps establish authenticity and prevent art fraud and theft
- ↳ a means of establishing provenance and ownership of art pieces from here on out, irrefutable to artists, collectors, investors, galleries, insurance companies and using lawyers
- ↳ to works of art or any valuable collectible when the VIN (Vehicle Identification Number) concept is used or ISBN (International Standard Book Number) is used, to enable artists and owners to protect and uniquely identify a piece of art

FAR also provides...

- ↳ an online gallery for artists when they can check and sell their art, with a huge advantage over other online galleries that buyers will know they are getting the real thing
- ↳ an online location for collectors and other art buyers to buy art with the security of knowing that they are investing in permanently registered and recorded art objects
- ↳ a central location to report stolen art or art used to help with its recovery
- ↳ secure, electronic transfer of ownership of art pieces so that there is a permanent record of new ownership, available for making art pieces, establishing authenticity, for insurance purposes and so on
- ↳ sustainable online certificates of authenticity for artists to use and print right from their computer
- ↳ a general resource for artists and art lovers where they can learn more and where they can find resources to help them in their creative work

You are eligible to become a member of the Fine Art Registry. We hope you will. There are many advantages for all artists and collectors.

How to transfer ownership of a piece of art or other collectible.
Note: If you do not formally transfer ownership, the database will NOT reflect that you are the current owner. Becoming a member is absolutely FREE and all ownership transfers are FREE.

Steps to transfer ownership:

1. Log on to www.FineArtRegistry.com
2. Click on Join FAR and follow the on-screen instructions to become a member.
3. Confirm and Check Out.
4. Once checked in complete, the screen that appears is "Have Registered For Tag" page. Under Account Services, simply click on "Full Ownership Transfer" and fill in the follow boxes. You will receive a message at the top of the screen that your Transfer Request has been processed. At the same time FAR will send an email notification to you that the transfer request has been sent to the artist for approval.
5. When the request is received by the artist, an approval request should follow within 48 hours. If for some reason you do not receive an email notifying you of the approval of the transfer of ownership, you should contact the artist or seller of the item directly and/or log in to place a second transfer request.

In completing the online transfer of ownership, you play a critical role in ensuring that the provenance/history of ownership remains current. If for some reason you ever decide to resell this artwork, art collectors will appreciate that you have taken the time and the necessary steps to ensure proper provenance, thereby increasing its value. This simple transfer process via the Fine Art Registry website (www.FineArtRegistry.com) is well worth the few minutes it takes to complete the process.
